Workshop Description: This course is designed for clinical supervisors of psychology trainees in practicum and internship settings. We will review research, theory and practice of clinical supervision with a focus on beginning the supervisory relationship, ethical issues in supervision, multicultural issues, and addressing problems in the supervisory relationship. We will explore the varying roles supervisors can play (e.g. consultant, teacher, evaluator) with the overall goal of further developing competent supervisory skills that reflect an ability to form a supervisory alliance and give appropriate, accurate feedback to supervisees. The course is intended to help supervisors further develop positive and productive supervisory alliances that promote clinical competencies and multicultural competency. The course also emphasizes ways in which supervisors can examine their own emotional reactions in order to inform and enhance the supervisory process.

Instructor Bio: Patrick Petti, Ph.D. is currently in private practice in Pleasanton CA. He is a retired Associate Professor from the California School of Professional Psychology at Alliant International University – San Francisco Campus, where he served on the faculty for 25 years and taught courses in Clinical Supervision, Clinical and Ethical Issues, Professional Psychology, Dissertation Research and Child Development. He also served as the Director of Professional Training at CSPP-SF, CAPIC Executive Director and served on the Board of Directors for of CPA Div I, Div II and CAPIC.

After attending this workshop participants will be able to:

1. Develop greater awareness of theory and practice of clinical supervision
2. Discuss a range of ethical issues in supervision
3. Apply an understanding of the literature on supervision in ongoing clinical supervisory relationships
4. Utilize supervision methods presented in this course in their professional activities
5. Assess clinical competencies in supervisees by demonstrating appropriate evaluative authority
