Workshop Description:

Change is an inevitable part of life; and so it is with the Rorschach. This workshop will focus on bringing Comprehensive System-trained psychologists up to date with the new Rorschach Performance Assessment System (R-PAS), which builds on and expands the rich Exner tradition. Participants will learn about changes in administration, coding and interpretation in the R-PAS system. The program will also include presentation of case material and analysis of the material using the R-PAS system. This is an intermediate level course, and presumes previous knowledge of the Rorschach Inkblot Method.
